He also had a pecuniary interest in a matter to be discussed and he felt therefore that he would have difficulty in chairing the meeting effectively.

Councillor Tina Woodward said that she had reported the matter to Shropshire Highways.

170. LOCAL ROADS AND FOOTPATHS

a) Pedestrian Refuge at Quatt

There was nothing further to report at this time.

b) Traffic Calming Measures: Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS)

Resolved

- i) that the Council seek advice from Shropshire Highways and the Road Safety partnership on the following proposals:
- to relocate the existing VAS sign to the other end of Quatt Village, near to the junction with Wootton Lane.
- to place a new VAS with a sad or smiley face feature and with data capture facility where the existing sign is currently situated, near to Quatt Farm Shop.
- ii) that the Clerk obtain further information about the costs and operation of the data retrieval option.
- c) The BOAT (Byway Open to All Traffic)

Councillor Tina Woodward made the following report:

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"I have been contacted by a number of local residents who remain concerned with the condition of a number of Byway Open to All Traffic (BOATs) in the Division. Holt Lane to Wootton Lane BOAT is a byway

already under discussion with Shropshire Council's Outdoor Recreation Team regarding Officers investigating the option of actioning a temporary Traffic Regulation Order prohibiting motorised vehicles for this byway, prior to the highlighted concerns by local residents since the Christmas and New Year Holiday.

Concerns being raised with me are in my opinion policing related as I have received reports of trail motorbike riders and in some case 4x4

off roaders still utilising the byways in the Division. Below in blue is an extract of an update to Alveley and Romsley Parish Council prior to their February meeting, as they didn't hold a January meeting due to unforeseen circumstances. However it is relevant to Quatt Malvern Parish as it is an update regarding my actions to date in response to local concerns being raised with me and my actions to date, regarding Shropshire Council Outdoor Recreation and West Mercia Police:

A Police Officer from Bridgnorth's Safer Neighbourhoods Policing Team scheduled a Teams meeting with me last week (21/1/2021). Unfortunately, the Officer was unable to make the meeting due to a policing matter which took precedence. Subsequently the Officer has communicated that he will get back to me as soon as possible. I have outlined the local concerns regarding the BOATs and also potential speeding by a number of off road users on the lanes which connect the BOATs.

I have also highlighted to West Mercia Police concerns regarding the BOATs being used during this period of restricted movement as I know the BOATs in the Division are still attracting frequent visits by trail riders (off road motorcyclists). Whilst out for exercise I met two such groups on the Coach Lane and I had a chat with them. One rider suggested that they are entitled to continue to use the BOATs as it is recognised as exercise. I have raised this matter with the Police for clarification and also copied in our MP Philip Dunne. I also emailed the Police and Crime Commissioner. I personally do not view this as

exercise. They were also travelling in groups and potentially they may have travelled from outside the area.

The Police and Crime Commissioner's Office has responded that this is a local matter for the Police and they forwarded my concerns to the Police as it is viewed as potential breaches of Covid-19 guidelines. I am waiting to hear back from the Police.

From Shropshire Council's perspective: My understanding is Outdoor Recreation Officers are intending to make site visits (walk the route) to a number of BOATs in the Division, following receipt of emails and photographs from a number of local residents and I.

I have stressed that their site visits should take place as soon as possible and that Outdoor Recreation's decisions regarding what actions are required following their site visits be conveyed back to me and interested parties.

I have also asked once again that Outdoor Recreation Officers consider applying seasonal TROs prohibiting motorised vehicles during the winter months to the most badly affected BOATs.

Shropshire Council's Communities Overview Committee which met on 25/01/2021 of which I am a member, discussed Outdoor Partnerships Team, Public Rights of Way Update 2021. It became evident during the meeting that Shropshire Council is not the only Council experiencing difficulties with the increased usage of their local rights of way. I would add that it is not only issues with an element of off road motorised vehicles users who are not treating the countryside with respect, there are a number of mountain bikers and horse riders straying from bridleways.

I am suggesting to residents that they raise their concerns directly with Shropshire Council <u>outdoor.recreation@shropshire.gov.uk</u> and if they are policing matters, they contact Bridgnorth Safer Neighbourhoods Policing Team. Residents can also copy me into their emails, if they wish, which can be helpful"

d) Wootton Ford

<u>Resolved</u> that the report be noted and that Shropshire Council contact the Chairman or the Clerk to arrange the site visit.

171. REPORT OF THE SHROPSHIRE COUNCILLOR

In addition to the other matters on which she had spoken, Councillor Tina Woodward confirmed that alterations to some of the refuse collection rounds were to be introduced and that new timetables would be issued to the affected households.

The Chairman thanked Councillor Woodward for her report.

172. NATIONAL TRUST REPORT

Marcus Halliwell spoke about the planning application which the Trust had presented for an extension to the car park at Comer Woods. He explained that the present car park was often at full capacity and visitors were resorting to parking in the entrance to Lodge Farm. The proposed works would not be expensive, using crushed stone for the new surface and an earth bund to separate the areas.

The Trust were also intending to introduce a dog walking policy on the Estate.

He undertook to see that the rubbish at the BOAT was removed.

The Chairman thanked Mr Halliwell for his report.

173. PARISH AMENITIES

a) Noticeboards

The Clerk reported on the position in regard to the existing noticeboards.

<u>Resolved</u> that the existing noticeboards be reinstated for the time being and one new aluminium noticeboard be purchased and evaluated.

b) <u>Proposed Capital Investment Programme at Hampton Loade Water Treatment Works</u>

The notes of the meeting held between representatives of South Staffordshire Water and the local community were received and considered. It was agreed that the extra traffic generated by the works would be the cause of most disruption to the local residents. Marcus Halliwell confirmed that the Water company had approached the National Trust with a view to land owned by the Trust being used as a vehicle parking area during the works but that nothing definite had been agreed so far.

Councillor Tina Woodward agreed to raise the concerns with Shropshire Highways.

Resolved that the report be noted.

174. REGISTER OF ELECTORS

The Clerk reported that the new register of electors had been received and that he would report on the latest number on the register at the next meeting.
